Commercial Appeal papers can be defined as focusing on either new applications of scientific research, market research, consumer trends, regulatory guidelines or papers with a generic appeal to food industries, academia or consumers, but still based on sound science and clearly related to the seminar topic. Please limit your abstract to 250 words and submit it by email no later than 31 August to katherine.flynn@safeconsortium.org.
